Foreword

This second edition of the panorama is a powerful signal: our startups are now aiming to compete on a global scale. With 18,000 active companies and 450,000 direct jobs, the ecosystem has built a foundation solid enough to pursue this ambition — one backed by investors who are focusing their funding on projects able to scaling up rapidly.

This investor confidence is directly reflected in the European fundraising rankings, where France ranks third on the continent, with an average ticket size higher than that of its British and German neighbors. These amounts give our most advanced companies the concrete means to establish themselves directly in Europe, North America, and Asia — bringing French innovation to the markets where the real competition takes place.

This same drive to scale is now spreading to major French corporations, which are playing an increasingly active role in the ecosystem by becoming true partners to startups, accelerating the spread of innovation throughout our economy.

I am convinced that this edition marks a milestone: the moment when our ecosystem claims its place among the world's leading tech players.

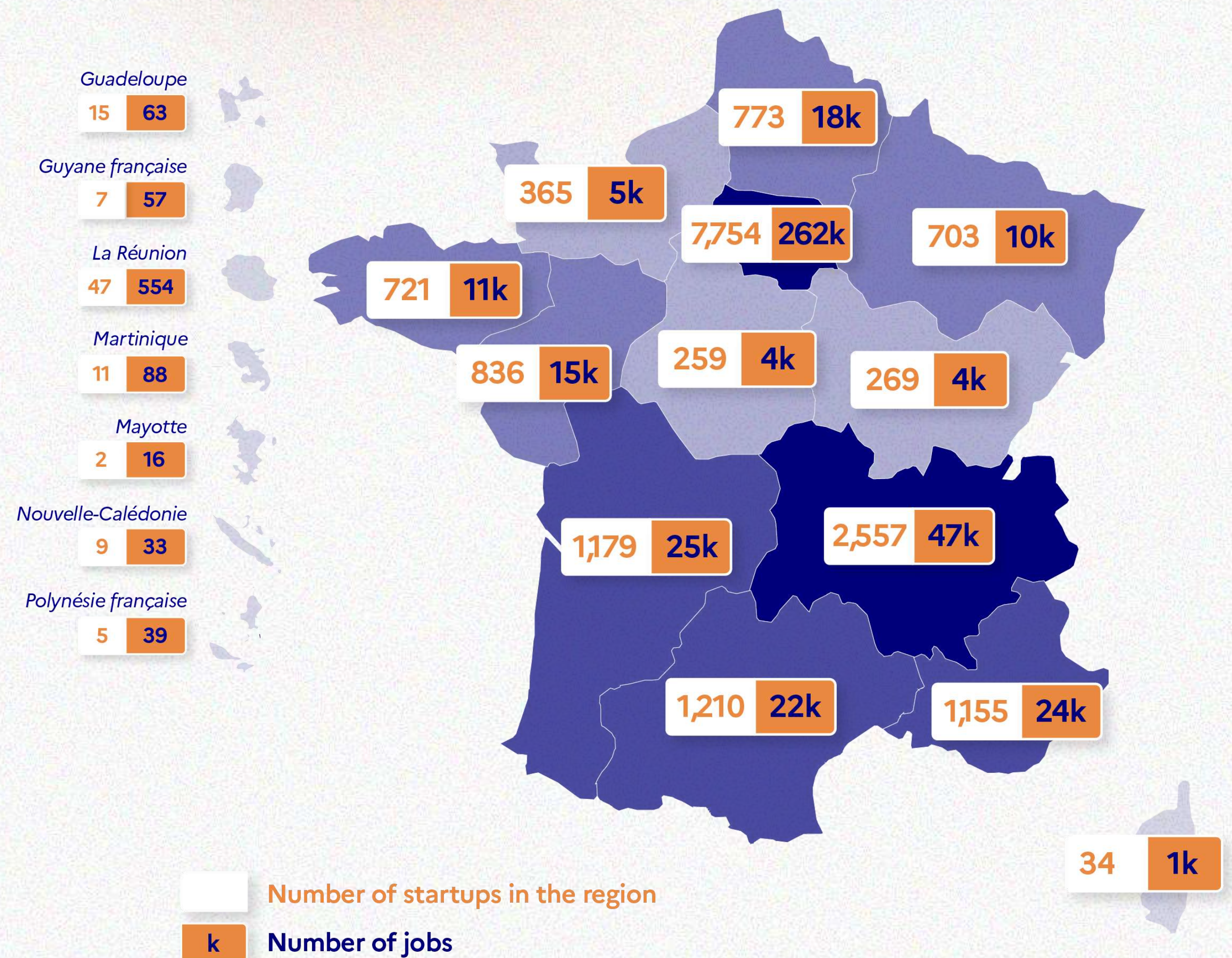

*FRENCH TECH CONFIRMS ITS ROLE
AS AN ECONOMIC DRIVER*

From Brittany to Occitanie : startups shaping the French economy

- **18,000** active startups
- **450,000** direct jobs

The French startup ecosystem is holding its historic level, both in the number of startups and in jobs: a **remarkable sign of stability**. This resilience stems above all from a **growing ability to attract talent and investment** throughout the country. The map points to a **gradual rebalancing**: while Paris region (57%) still leads the way, its relative share is slowly eroding in favour of other innovation hubs such as Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes.



Startup employment grows despite the headwinds, rising in every region

- **+5%** in direct jobs since January 1, 2026*

Startups have become a **key engine for job creation in France**, driven above all by sectors like AI and healthcare. Growth, however, is unevenly spread: the Paris region alone accounts for 70% of new jobs, although regions such as Nouvelle-Aquitaine and Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes are posting **very positive trends**.

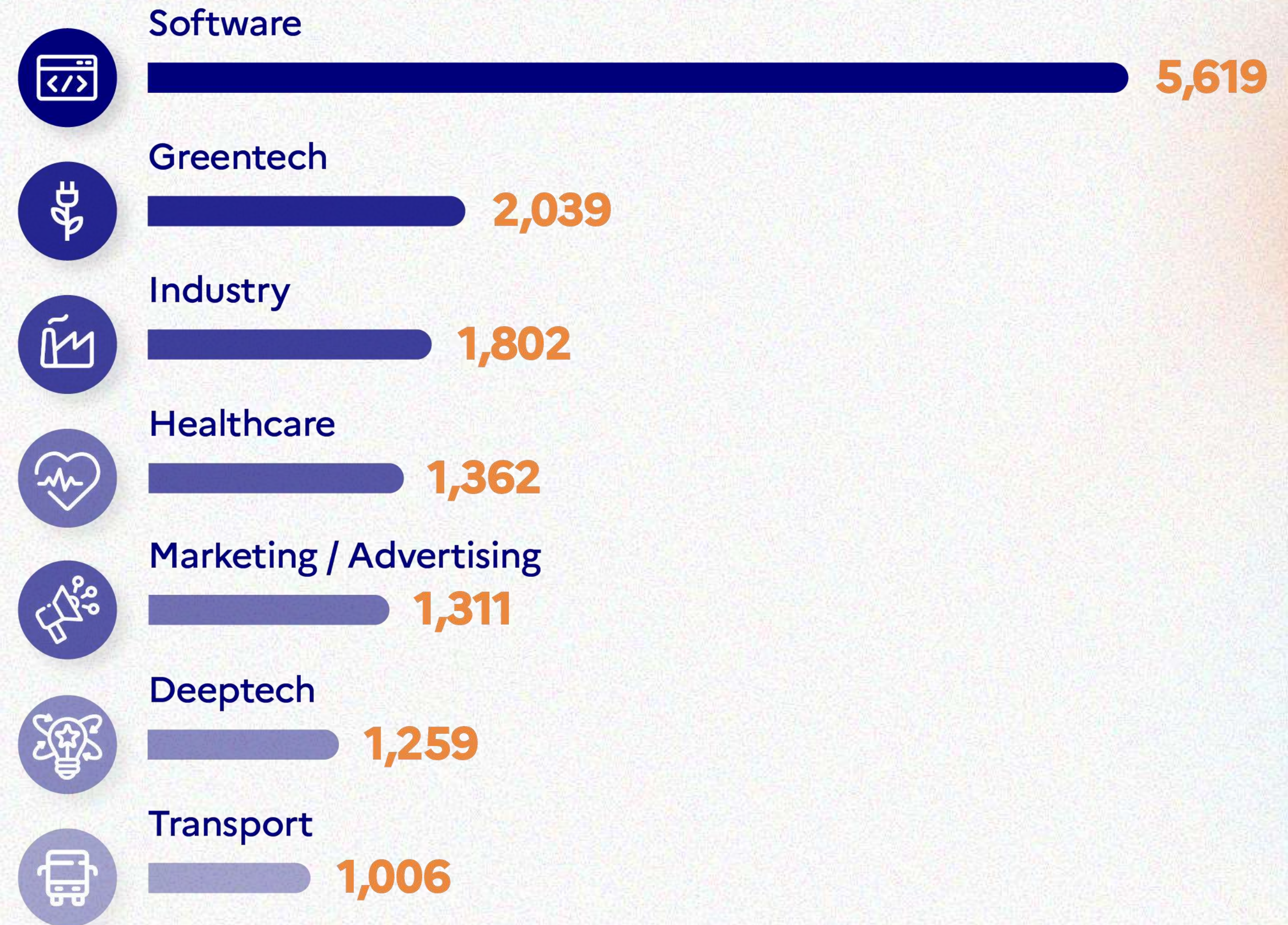

Software, Healthcare, Greentech: the sectors redefining French industry

The sector breakdown of startups has **remained broadly stable**, but employment has shifted across several segments.

Software still leads the way with 121,000 jobs. Other sectors are rising to address today's biggest challenges: **greentech** (51,030 jobs, +4.9% on 2025) is tackling the climate emergency, while **healthcare** (37,310 jobs, +5.3%) is harnessing technological advances to reinvent itself.



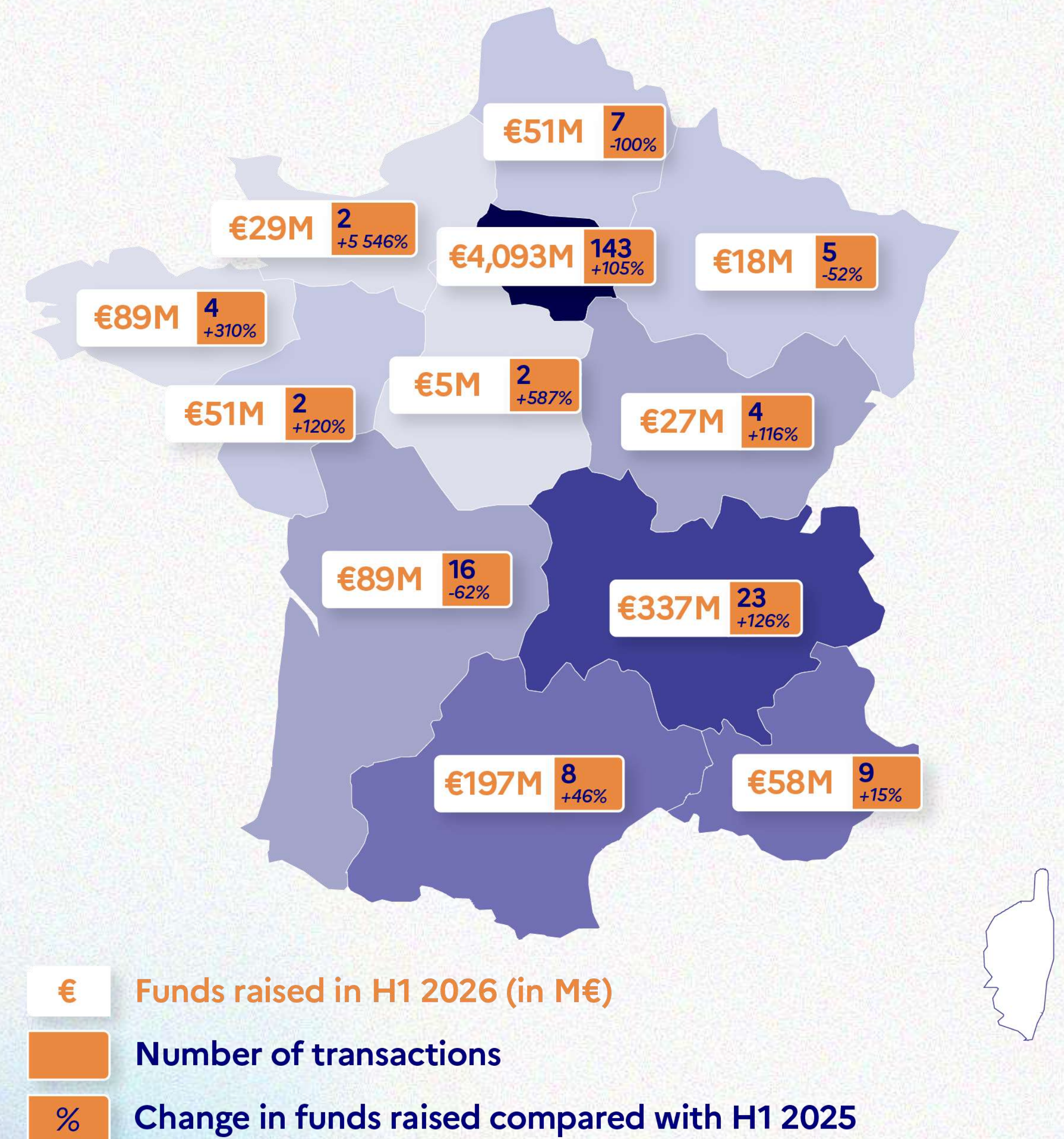
Number of startups by sector

Innovation funding keeps up its momentum across all regions

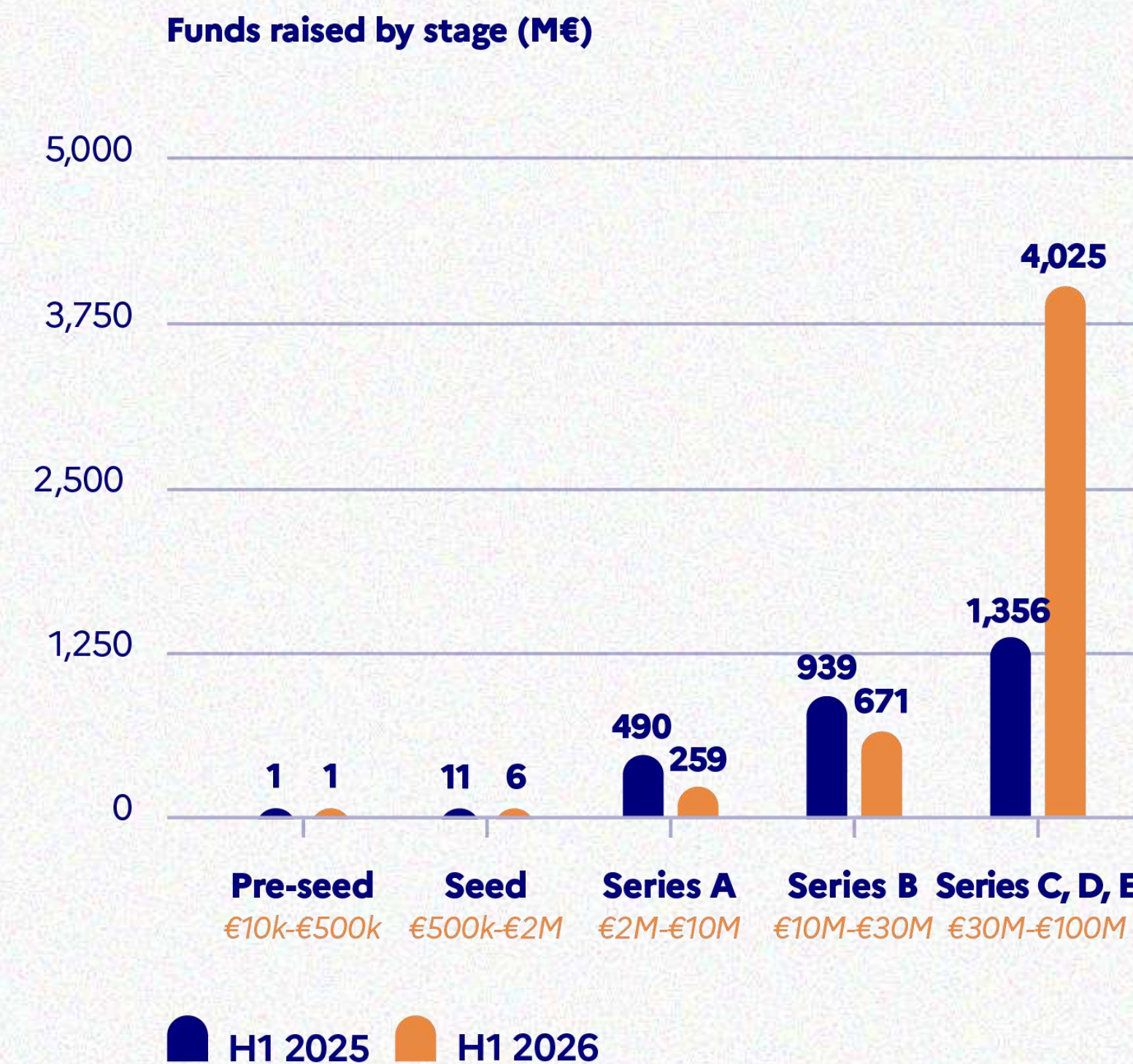
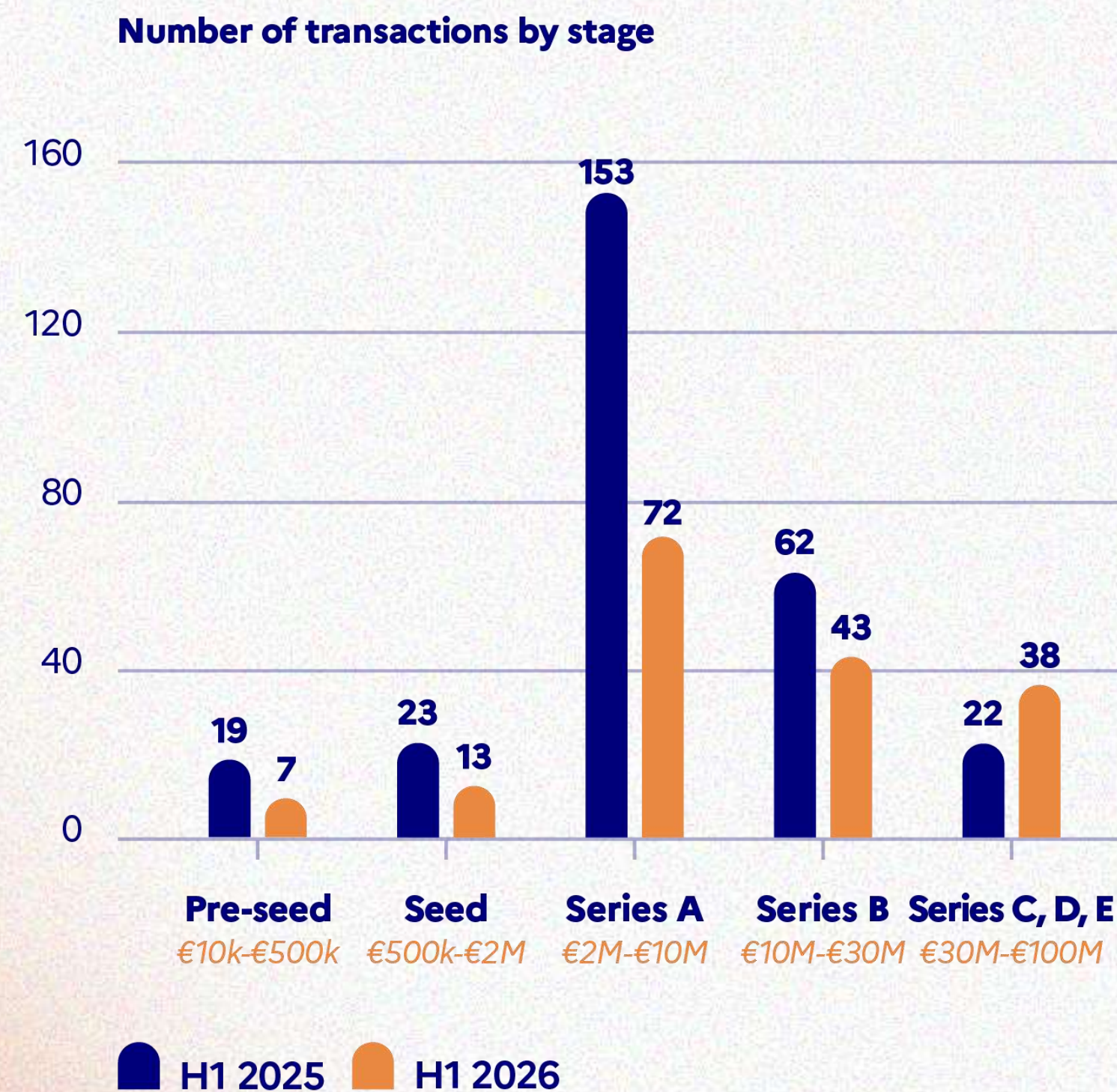

Fundraising has hit unprecedented levels, with **amounts raised up 77%** in a single year, cementing France's status as a **major destination for international capital**. The Paris region remains the country's leading investment hub, yet several regions posted record growth in 2026, notably Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes and Occitanie, powered by deeptech. This **give-and-take between the capital and fast-rising regions** is what makes the ecosystem so diverse.



Fundraising: fewer deals, more ambitious projects

The ecosystem is clearly maturing: **investors now back projects with the potential to scale fast.** Amounts raised in Series C, D and E rounds have nearly tripled in a year, a sign that France is betting on **champions able to compete on the world stage.** Behind this shift lies a shared ambition: to raise global leaders "made in France".



Innovation is thriving in every region

Every French region now boasts its own **tech gems**, from Brittany to Nouvelle-Aquitaine, overseas territories included. These local success stories rest on record-breaking fundraising and **vibrant regional ecosystems**.

France among Europe’s most dynamic ecosystems

With fundraising rising sharply, France holds on to its spot on the European podium, just behind the UK and Germany. It even **leads the field in average deal size (€23.2M)**, clear evidence that French startups command funding on a par with the best in Europe and **keep attracting international investors**.

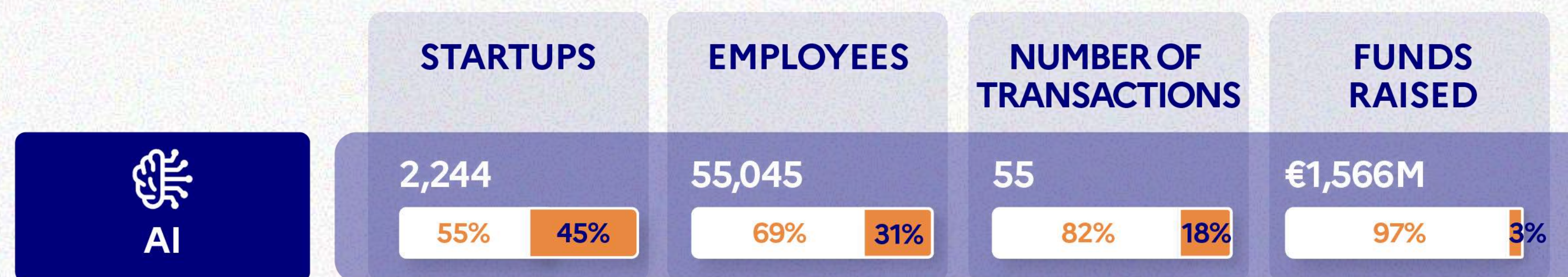

- **2,244 startups** in artificial intelligence recorded in 2026, compared with **1,917** in 2025

Artificial intelligence has become the **cornerstone of French Tech**, propelled by ambitious ventures such as AMI Labs and Mistral AI. These successes rest on a well-structured ecosystem where research, talents and capital converge.



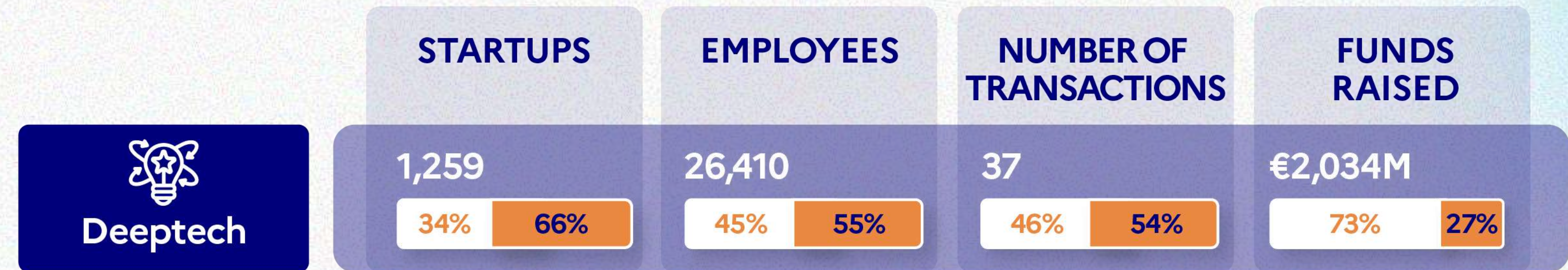

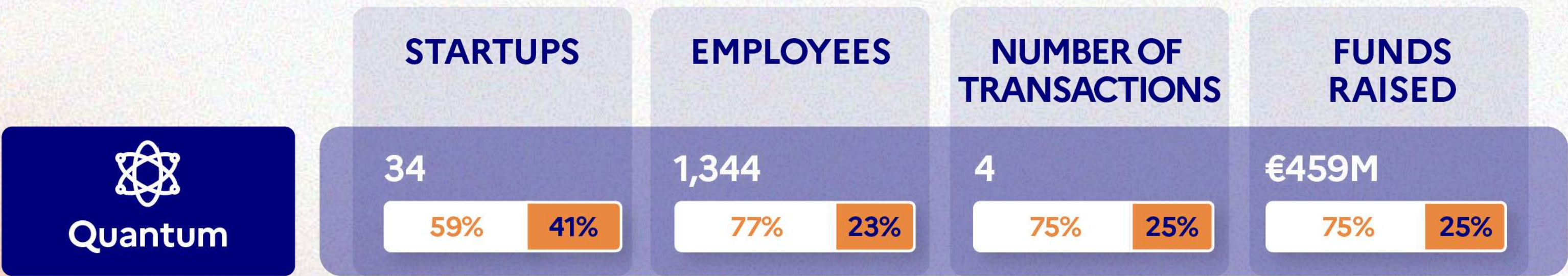
Robotics Solutions for tomorrow's challenges

Space French Tech reaches for the stars

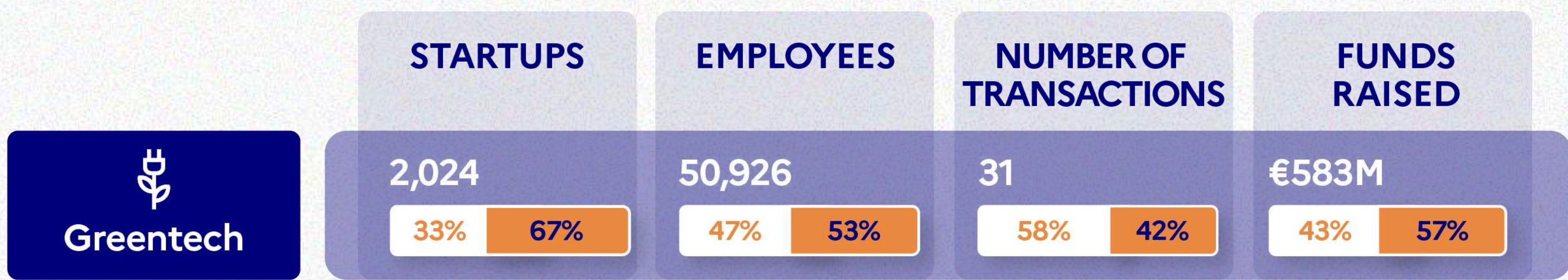

Greentech The engine of the green transition

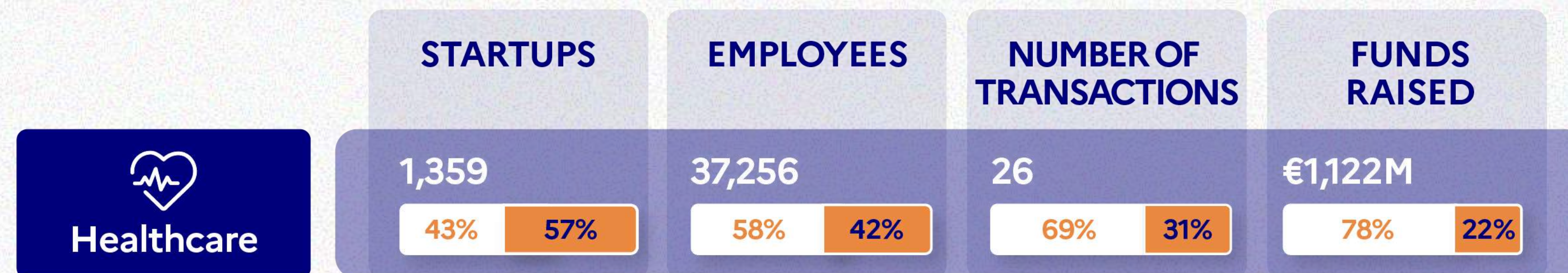

Healthcare The first testing ground for breakthrough technologies

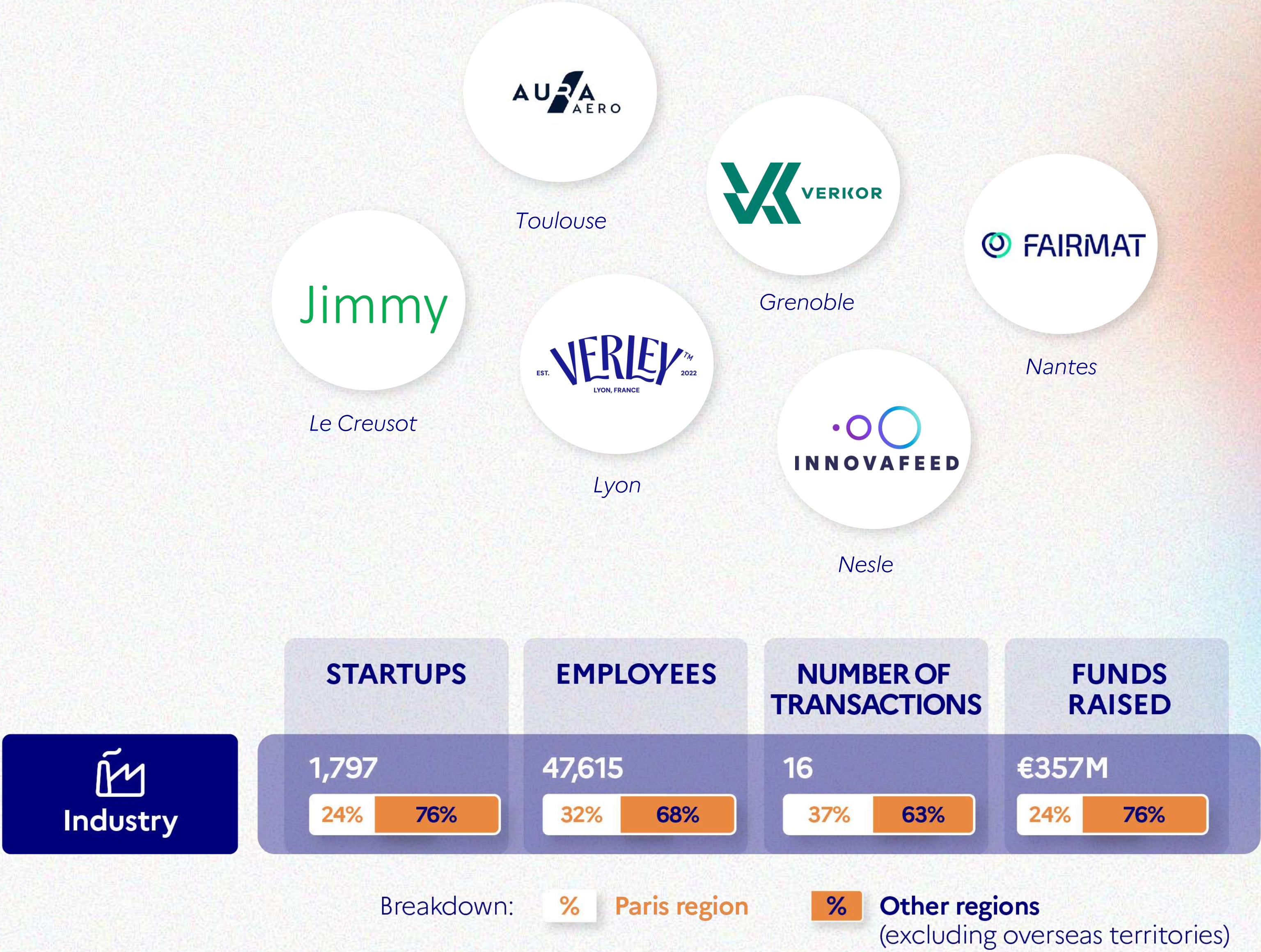

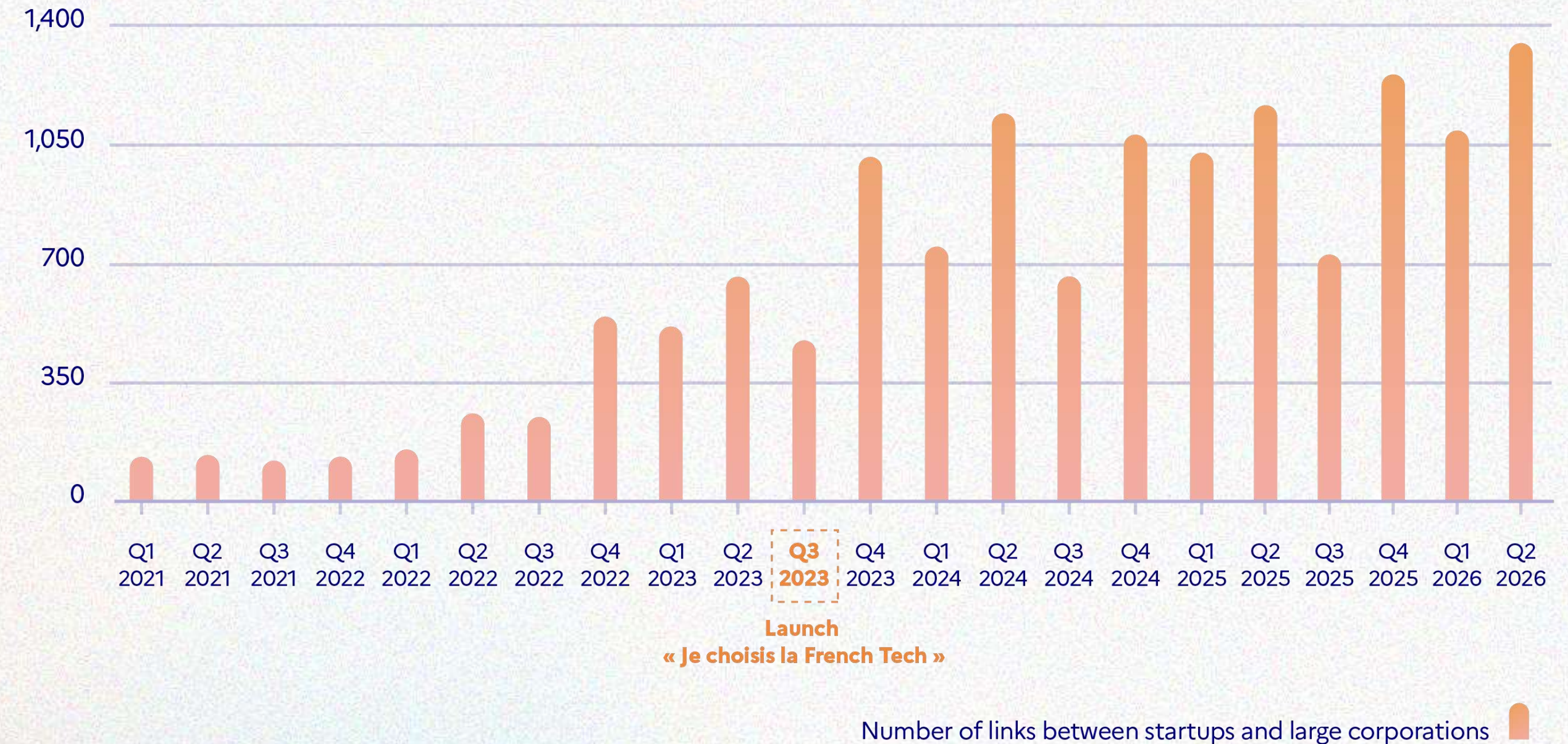

Major French corporations no longer watch the French Tech scene from the sidelines: they have become **active partners** in it. Together they are reshaping entire sectors and **boosting the competitiveness of the French economy**, proof that innovation is everyone's business.

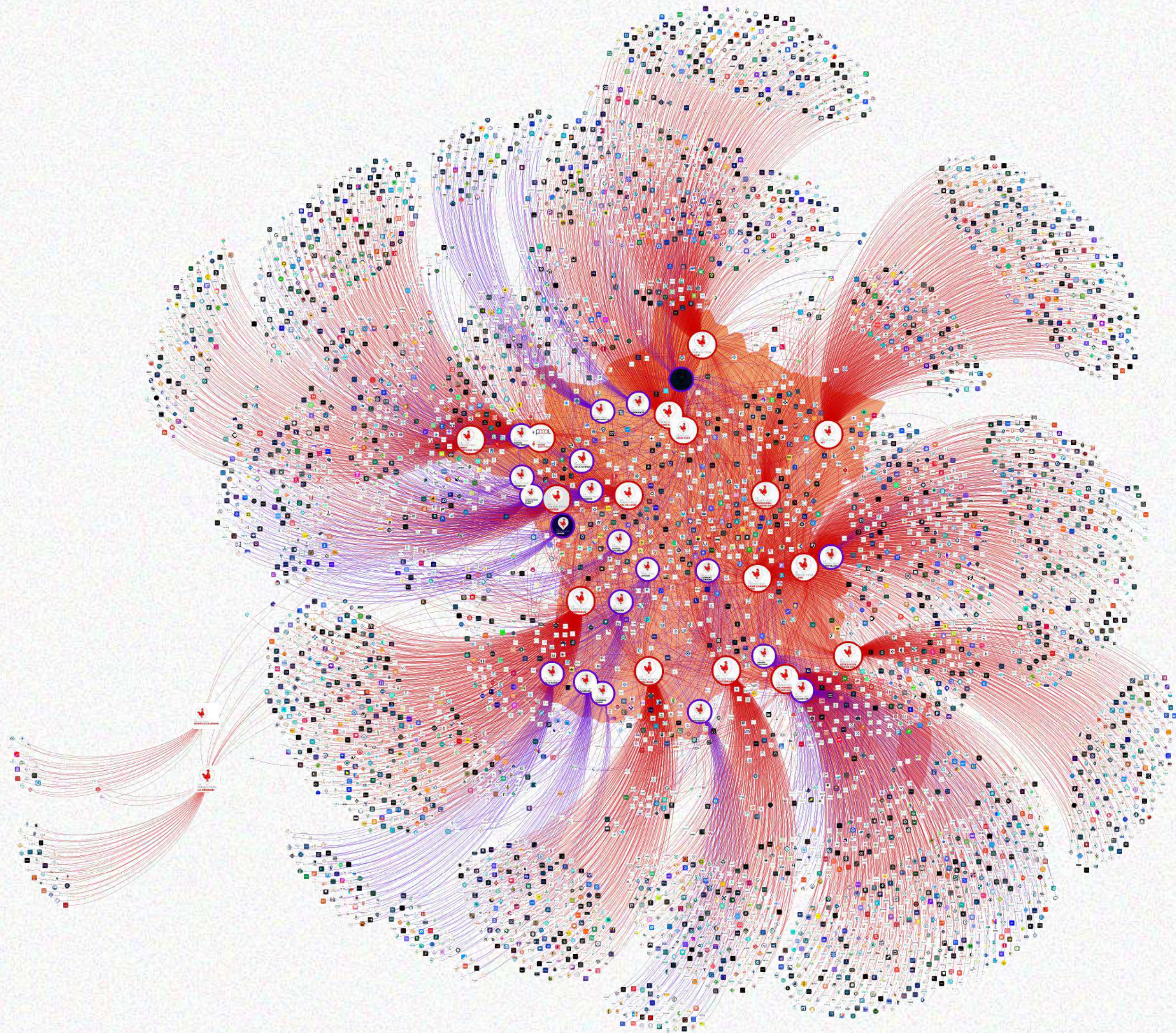

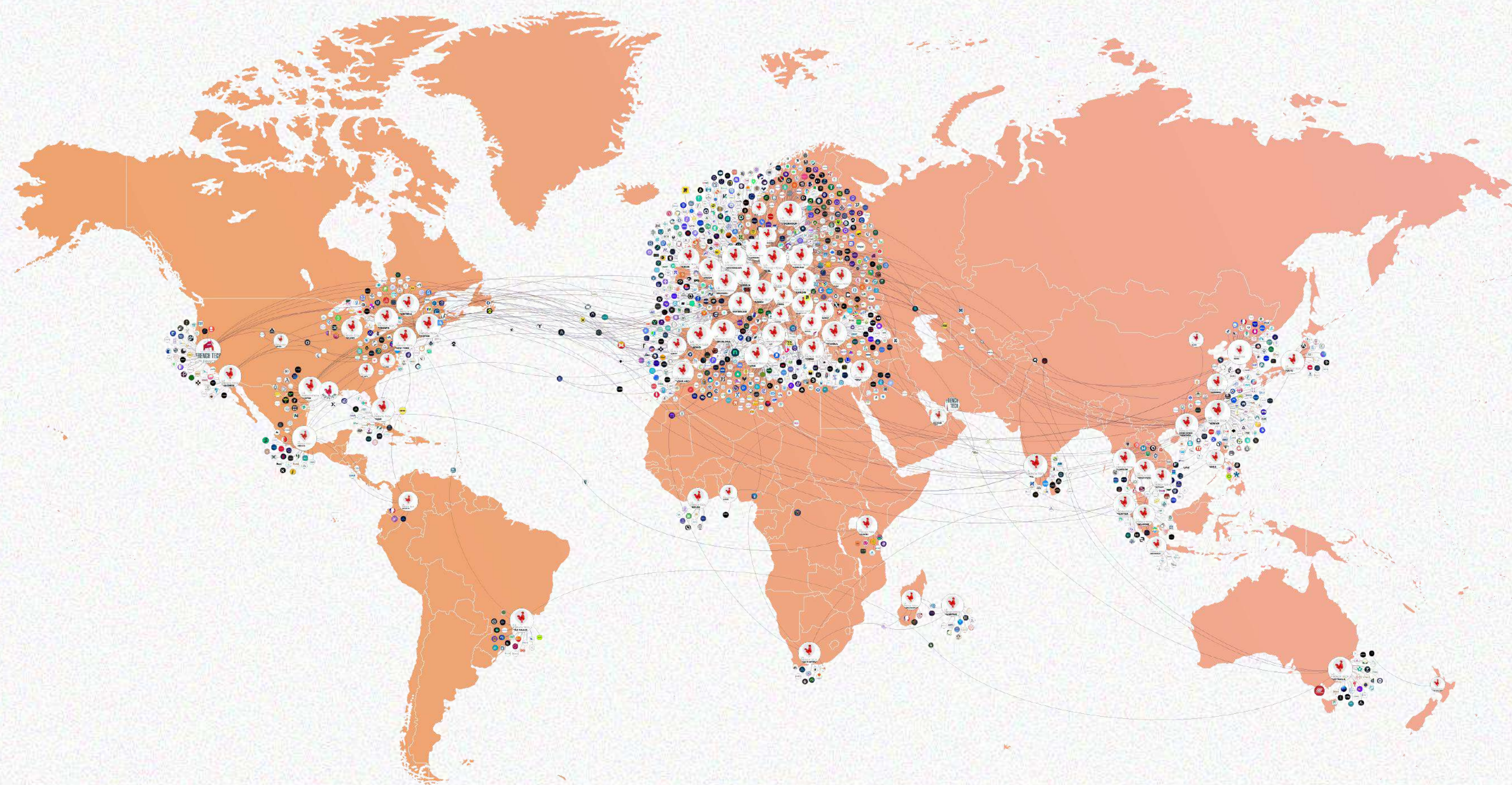

Appendix

Methodology

The statistical data presented in this document comes from Motherbase and from internal data collected by the French Tech Mission, including information and initiatives reported by the French Tech Capitals and Communities network.

Data collection and qualification

Motherbase is an AI solution developed by a French startup. The statistical data derived from Motherbase is built on, and extracted from, the monitoring of conversations between 2,500 "innovation catalysts" and their ecosystems. Catalysts include: public and private large enterprises, incubators and accelerators, local authorities, government ministries, funds, etc.

These "relationships" identified between catalysts and companies are derived from conversations analyzed across social networks. For a "conversation" to be taken into account, it must, on the one hand, involve the accounts of both organizations concerned and, on the other, address "business" or "innovation" topics directly or indirectly. Motherbase's algorithms have analyzed tens of millions of conversations.

Since 2020, Motherbase has detected and qualified relationships between these 2,500 entities and 200,000 organizations worldwide, including 70,000 startups.

Among these, 21,000 are French startups, of which 18,000 are classified as active.

When an entity is detected by Motherbase, its value proposition (found on its website and/or social media) is retrieved. It is then analyzed (machine learning) to qualify the entity according to:

- Type of organization: startup, SME, association, public body, large enterprise, etc.
- Sector of activity: from A for Agritech to W for Water management, including Greentech, Fintech, etc.
- Technologies mastered, such as AI, IoT, or embedded systems, etc.

All data is updated monthly, making it possible, among other things, to track the headcount evolution of each monitored entity.

Methodology

Inclusion criteria

- Startup definition: for Motherbase, a startup is an innovative company under 15 years old with fewer than 800 employees as of January 1, 2026, offering "scalable" products or services (i.e., growth not correlated with headcount).
- Companies that are members of the French Tech 120 and French Tech 2030 programs are automatically included, regardless of their size.

By cross-referencing information on hiring momentum, website update frequency or social media posting, relationships with large enterprises, etc., a momentum score is automatically calculated for each startup in the database:

A: all indicators are "green"

B: at least one warning sign

C: several converging signals suggest the entity is no longer active

Blank: assessment in progress

Excluded from the statistical analysis are: companies rated C, companies with zero employees created before 2020, and communication agencies. These excluded companies account for 11.7% of the total number of companies identified and represent 1% of employment.

Analysis and updates

Motherbase relies on human analysis of samples of organizations within the database, which serve as labeled training sets for the solution's machine learning algorithms. These samples are regularly retrained to limit model drift.

Methodology

Funding stages

Each transaction is classified as Pre-Seed, Seed, Series A, B, C... based on reference thresholds (amount, company maturity), independently of the commercial label announced by the company or reported in the press.

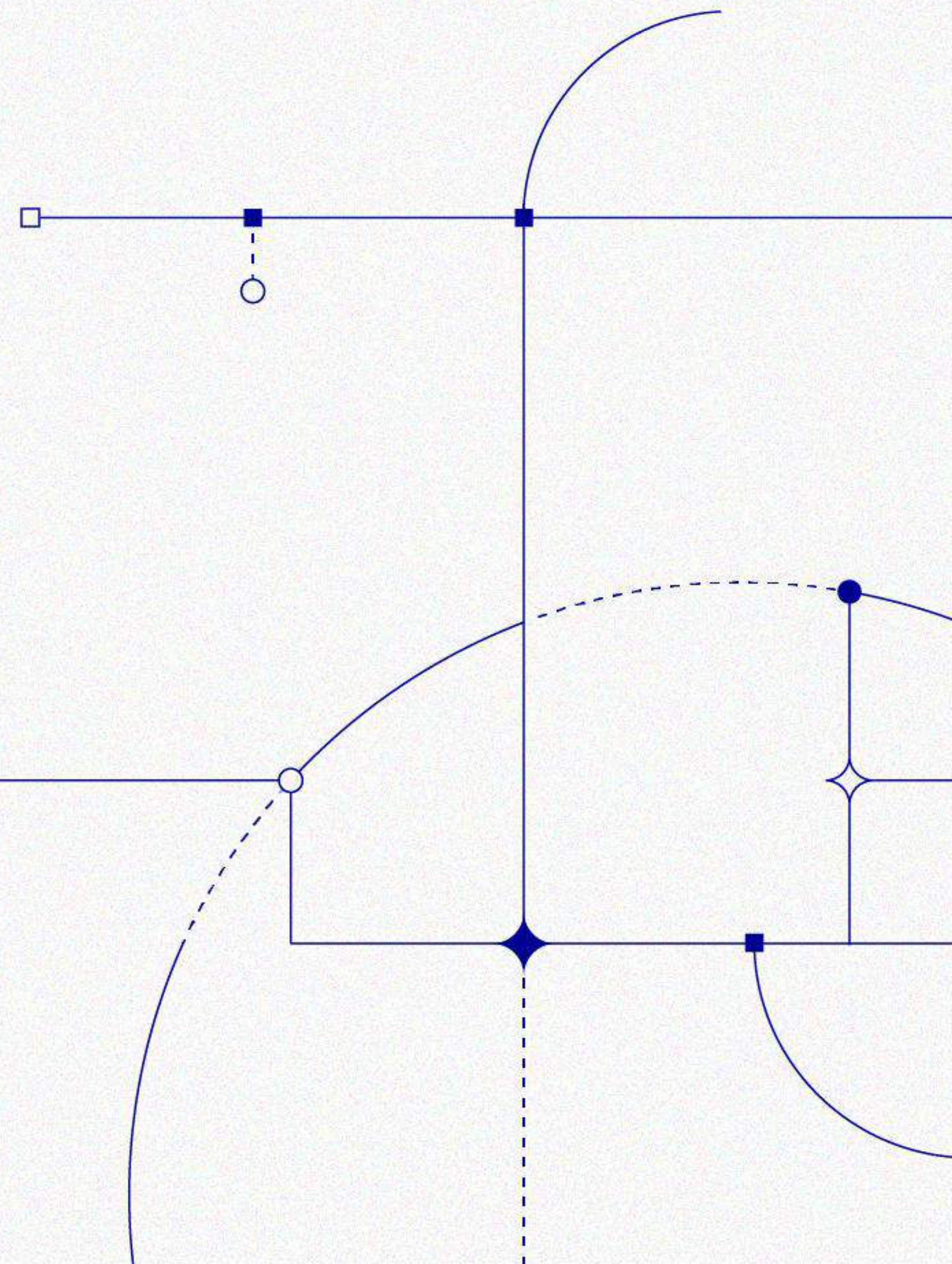
Fundraising and post-IPO financing are not included in these figures.

Example: AMI Labs' €890M fundraising round (March 2026), presented as a Seed round, is classified as Series C, D, or E in the Panorama given its amount.

Deeptech

- Startups arising directly from scientific research or technological disruption are classified as Deeptech. As a rule, generic artificial intelligence, greentech/energy tech, and gaming are not included in this category and are counted within their own verticals.
- Motherbase identifies 3,100 Deeptech entities in France, of all sizes, of which approximately 1,500 meet Motherbase's startup criteria (see definition above).



Methodolgy

Employment barometer

The startup employment barometer in France is based on AI analysis of a sample of approximately 8,000 French startups conducted in August 2026.

Each month, jobs created and eliminated by each startup in the sample are counted (based on employee statements on professional networks).

Each startup is classified by AI according to its field of activity, the technologies it masters, and its location.

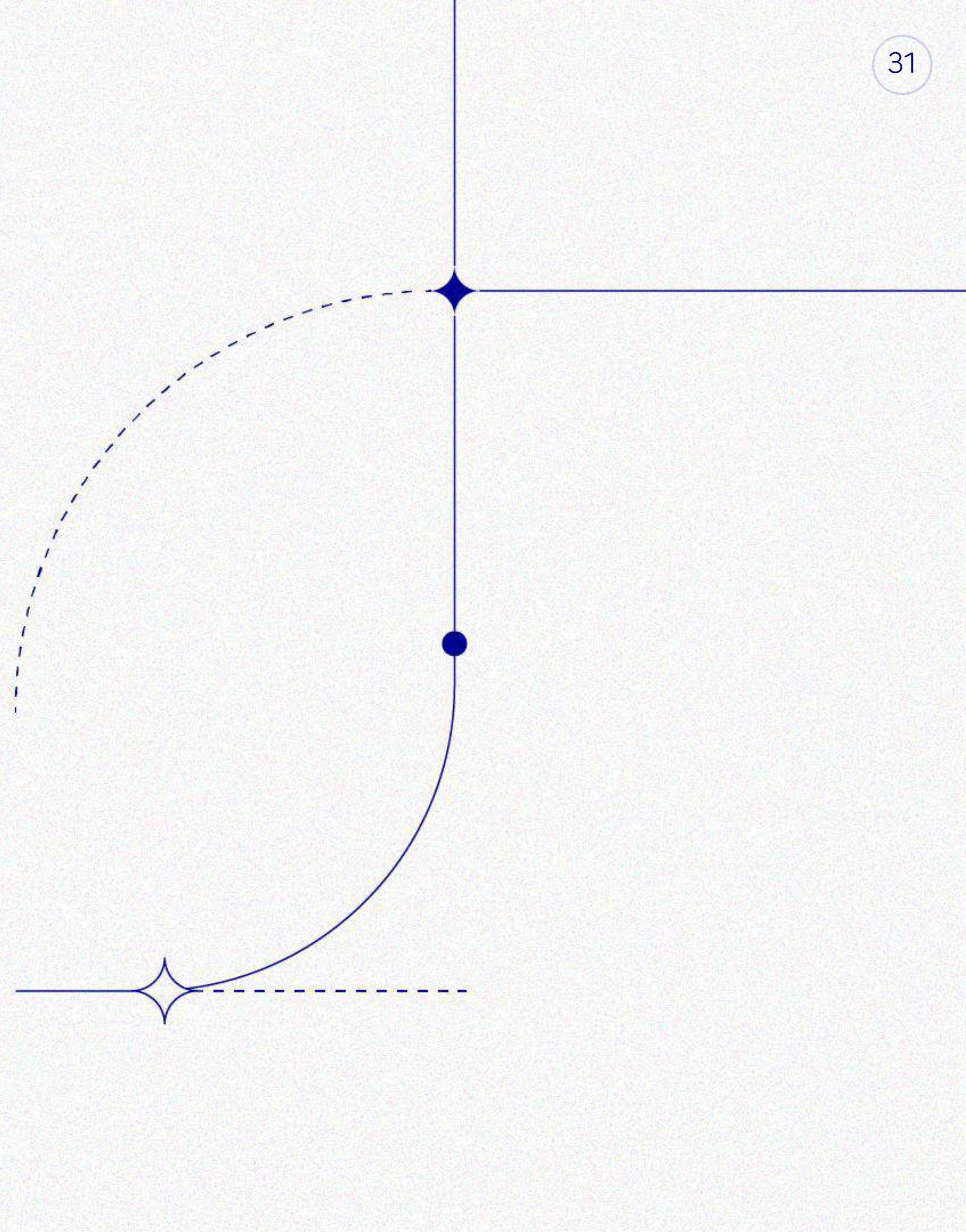
This barometer is based on a constant sample: it therefore takes into account neither startup creations nor closures over a calendar year. Companies that disappear are removed from the sample, and data is recalculated each month across the entire period.

The data presented is limited to the sample and makes it possible to observe employment trends across a broad sample of French startups. It covers direct employment only.
